Allow the Natural Resources Commission to schedule annual wolf hunting seasons. Provide criminal penalties for the unlawful possession or taking of wolves, but shield a person who lawfully captures or destroys a wolf from prosecution. Require a person who wishes to hunt wolves to obtain a wolf hunting license. Create a Wolf Management Advisory Council for the purpose of making nonbinding recommendations to the legislature regarding the proper management of wolves. Should this law be approved? YES <input type="radio"/> NO <input type="radio"/>	DELTA COUNTY 911 MILLAGE PROPOSAL To renew the authorization expiring after the December 1, 2014 levy, shall the previously voted increase in the tax limitation imposed under Article IX, Section 6 of the Michigan Constitution on the amount of taxes which may be imposed by the County of Delta against real and tangible personal property in the County be increased by up to three quarters of one mill (\$0.75 per \$1,000.00 per taxable valuation) on the taxable value of such property for a period of Five (5) years, beginning with the December 1, 2015 tax levy, inclusive, for the purpose of providing funds for the equipping, furnishing, and operating the Delta County 911 Emergency telephone answering and dispatch system, and shall the Delta County Board of Commissioners be authorized to levy such millage for this purpose? YES <input type="radio"/> NO <input type="radio"/>	BARK RIVER-HARRIS SCHOOLS OPERATING MILLAGE RENEWAL PROPOSAL This proposal will allow the school district to continue to levy the statutory rate of 18 mills on all property except principal residence and other property exempted by law, required for the school district to receive its revenue per pupil foundation allowance. Shall the limitation on the amount of taxes which may be assessed against all property, except principal residence and other property exempted by law, in Bark River-Harris Schools, Delta and Menominee Counties, Michigan, be increased by 18 mills (\$18.00 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation) for a period of 20 years, 2016 to 2035, inclusive, to provide funds for operating purposes; the estimate of the revenue the school district will collect if the millage is approved and levied in 2016 is approximately \$374,341.12 (17.0374 mills is a renewal of millage which will expire with the 2015 tax levy and .9626 mill is to restore millage lost as a result of the reduction required by the Michigan Constitution of 1963)?
